A big thank you to all the clubs and community members who made this project a success. Together, we serve — and together, we grow stronger.







#### 1<sup>st</sup> International Plastic Pellet Count. NW Coast of Washington State

Despite a downpour, a small hearty group searched for Plastic Pellets on Saturday morning along the Strait of Juan de Fuca at Shipwreck Point beach. They searched on the closest wrack line to the high tide line, to see if they could find plastic pellets, also called Nurdles. Nurdles are pieces of plastic less than 5 mm in size, about the size of a lentil. Despite looking carefully for two 10-minute timings, only one nurdle was found.

"They're the raw material that's used to make familiar plastic products like water bottles, grocery bags, and polystyrene foam takeout containers. These tiny plastics are frequently spilled, leaked or dumped into the environment, especially our waterways, during manufacturing and transport. As a result, an estimated 10 trillion plastic pellets now enter our oceans each year. Plastic pellets in the environment, especially waterways, threaten wildlife and public health. Animals may mistake nurdles for fish eggs or tadpoles, and if they ingest enough plastic they can starve. The pellets can also absorb harmful chemicals like DDT, PCBs, and mercury." International Plastic Pellet Count Toolkit

Lions Nancy and Roy then drove to the Pacific Ocean beach at Hobuck Beach to conduct two timed searches with teacher, Neuee Vitalis and her young son. This was a wholly different outcome. We searched the wrack line closest to the surf and almost without moving from our starting location, we found 28 of the tiny plastic pellets in two 10-minute timings. This finding is sobering as it indicates that this remote ocean beach probably contains thousands of plastic pellets.

Data is reported on the app Nurdle Patrol on my cell phone after each 10 minute search session. The report records the GPS location, the name of the group searching and the number of nurdles found. We also sent photos and observations in to the organizers of the event and international results will be published next week. We will follow up with Neah Bay Middle School students conducting more Pellet Counts, working as Citizen Scientists.



### **Email/Give Oral Reports to Committees or Club**

MD19 – District I Bernie Jensen District Environmental Chairperson May 1, 2025

Hello everyone, it's been a busy April. Kamloops Brock Central Lions Club and I have been working on a few different projects this spring.

 South Thompson River Beach Cleanup – this was a City of Kamloops initiative that we supported by cooking, serving, providing refreshments, etc. We served approximately 150 volunteers who were in attendance to help with the clean-up.



2) Lac Du Bois Grasslands Clean up - this event was organized by BC Grasslands Conservation Council along with the Kamloops Naturalist Club. This was Kamloops Brock Central Lions club's first year for supplying food for the volunteers. We cooked and served about 40 volunteers who collected garbage in the area including five 5gallon pails of palette nails.





Community Gardens – our Lions club donated funds to two community gardens to help with replacing boards along the sides of the raised bed gardens. Both of these gardens were along the South Thompson River; one was called the Rivers Community Garden and the other was called the Riverside Park Community Garden. There are about seven community gardens on city land in Kamloops.





Kamloops Brock Central Lions Club donated funds to the BC Parks Foundation in support of the Juniper Ridge Grasslands Park. The Parks Foundation raised enough to secure over 500 acres of grassland. Our club got mentioned in a BC Parks

Foundation press release for having contributed to raising the funds needed to purchase the land.

### **Oral Reports**

DG Tammy Allan reported District S Convention used re-usable dinnerware for all meals!!! In District S, Naches Lions and town are pursuing the idea of creating a Town Forest on one acre of land. They are hoping their town will "join with 52 cities around the world who have planted 232 pocket forests, with nearly a half million native trees."

In District I, Bernie mentioned that his Club is working to clear Pine Park of invasive plant species and they will be using goats for this work.

In District L, Carol said that her club continues to collect and recycle bottles and cans. Last month she shared the door hanger that the club members use when they knock on doors advising folks that they will come back by to pick up bottles and cans.
