Washington Secretary of State Charities Information: Constance Parbon is the Charities, Nonprofits, and Public Affairs Administrator under the Washington Secretary of State Corporations and Charities Division and has been with the division for seven years. Constance currently works towards expanding education and outreach throughout Washington State for small businesses regarding state compliance and Nonprofits and Charities regarding state compliance and internal governance. During her seven years Constance aided in the 2017 implementation of the online Corporations and Charities Filing System "CCFS". She continues to collaborate with IT development to further enhance and incorporate statutory changes within CCFS.
