Lions of MD19, I would like to share with you this email I received from our International First Vice President Fabricio Oliveira.

Beginning in February, FVDG/DGEs will be asked to submit their district's goals for the 2024-2025 Lion year. In a strategic effort to promote regionalization and individualization of goals at the multiple district and district levels, we are offering multiple district teams the opportunity to develop one S.M.A.R.T goal that reflects the needs of their areas and does not overlap Lions International goals.

Any multiple district that chooses to participate will need to communicate their goal to their FVDG/DGEs no later than February 1, 2024. GAT area leaders may provide a goal for districts that do not belong to a multiple district, if desired.

As the FVDG/DGE understands the needs of their districts best, they will also be able to work with their teams to develop district-specific targets that directly support MISSION 1.5 and each of the four mandatory Lions International goals. Once the submission platform becomes available in March, these goals and supporting action plans will need to be submitted to Lions International by May 30, 2024.

The four mandatory association goals for FVDG/DGEs are:

- In support of MISSION 1.5, FVDG/DGEs commit to work with their teams to achieve their membership growth targets.
- FVDG/DGEs commit to work with their teams to increase the percentage of Lion and Leo clubs reporting service.
- During the first quarter, FVDG/DGEs commit to work with their teams to promote and facilitate training for club officers and zone chairpersons.
- FVDG/DGEs commit to working with their teams to support LCIF in its endeavor to achieve its fundraising goal and increase our global impact.

Thank you for your continued dedication and support, we are building our future today. Our Leadership training school for the VDGE's and ZCE's will be held May 23-24, 2024 at the Silver Reef Casino, Ferndale WA, just prior to the Noon Luncheon opening of the Annual Convention May 24-25. I look forward to meeting all of you there.

Congratulations to the Vancouver East Lions Club for 80 years of service to the community. We just finished your celebration and had a great time with a lot of really great Lions. Thank you President Michael Cheng for inviting me.

The great tools for bringing in new members is the open house concept. There is a manual on the MD19 website that specifically tells you what steps to take to make this happen. Many people who have used this program have said that if you follow the program you will gain new members.


things they do in their community. You know it's the same thing we were doing in the old district, they all just like to serve their communities.

Lions Provide \$50,000 For Urgent Care Needs at Langley Memorial Hospital

Every day, the medical teams at Langley Memorial Hospital provide life-saving and life-changing care. As a community hospital, that care ranges from maternity care to urgent surgeries to diagnostic tests like MRIs and ultrasounds.

On Jan. 3 Langley's Lions Clubs presented a cheque for \$50,000 to the Langley Memorial Hospital Foundation as a matching commitment for the Foundation's Area of Greatest Need campaign

– funds that when matched with the \$57,086 in individual donations will go a long way to supporting local healthcare, close to home. The combined gift is from Lions Clubs International Foundation, Langley Lions Club, Fort Langley Lions Club and Aldergrove Lions Club.

Among the areas of urgent need targeted by the donation will be a state-of-the-art ultrasound that will replace an obsolete machine that simply can't provide the crisp, clear images needed for care teams to diagnose and treat an array of conditions.

"It is incredibly important that the community support their local hospital with urgent needs like this ultrasound, so that when people are ill or injured, they

can be diagnosed quickly, and get the care they need to return to good health as soon as possible," says PDG Ray Tremblay, Past President, Langley Lions Club.

The Area of Greatest Need campaign was founded to do just that – fund the hospital's current areas of greatest need. The capacity to purchase modern, state-of-the-art equipment to serve a growing and aging population often falls outside of funds provided by government health care resources and must be funded through the Langley Memorial Hospital Foundation.

"Community support is essential to ensuring Langley residents can get the care they need close to home and that the hospital has what it needs to care for the community in the timeliest manner," says Tim Staunton, the Foundation's Director of Philanthropy.

The longstanding support of organizations like the Lions is key.

"We've been very fortunate to have the Langley Lions' support for over 25 years," Staunton says, pointing to timely and essential donations like a new ventilator they provided during the pandemic.

"The response to last year's holiday campaign has been fantastic," Staunton says. "The community is very generous and supportive of local healthcare, and we are deeply grateful that the community has matched the Lions' generosity."

Peoples Bank Awards Grants to Regional Nonprofit

Excerpt from Article on Whatcom Talk

In a bid to help positively impact the communities in which it operates, six years ago Peoples Bank created the Peoples Bank Impact Grant program to help eligible nonprofits provide a long-lasting, positive impact on the community. This year, the Bellingham Central Lions Club was awarded a \$25,000 Peoples Bank Impact Grant, and Mount Vernon-based Children of the Valley was awarded a \$10,000 Peoples Choice Impact Grant.

We sat down with Bellingham Central Lions Club President Debbie Costello and Children of the Valley Executive Director Flora Lucatero to learn more about the missions of their organizations and how they'll put the grants to good use.

Peoples Bank Impact Grant

As a full-service community bank operated locally, Peoples Bank is no stranger to the needs of the communities in which it provides services. Thus, the Peoples Bank Impact Grant program was introduced in 2017 to help strengthen nonprofit organizations doing important work across the region. This year, the \$25,000 grant was awarded to the Bellingham Central Lions Club.

"The Bellingham Central Lions Club recently celebrated 102 years of being in this community," says Debbie Costello. "Along with the Haskell Eye Clinic, we support several programs, including the Wheelchair Warehouse and Books for Kids. There's always a need in the community for our services, so we are extremely grateful to receive this grant from Peoples Bank."

In operation for 12 years, the all-volunteer Haskell Eye Clinic provides free eye examinations and glasses for qualified low-income and homeless people in the community.

"The Haskell Eye Clinic was in need of an Ocular Coherence Tomography machine, or OCT, which is essentially an ultrasound that can get micron-level visibility inside the eyes to diagnose different conditions like glaucoma, retinopathy from diabetes, or optic nerve disease," says Costello.

Bellingham Central Lions Club used the \$25,000 grant to purchase the machine and installed it at the end of November. "This equipment has been a missing link at the eye clinic for quite some time," says Costello. "It cost the same amount of money as the grant award; it was just meant to be — a miracle."



"Getting out there in the community involves a lot of word of mouth and a lot of help from those who can direct people to our services and fund our work," Costello says. "We are a service organization and where there's a need, there's a Lion."

Motion Passed in Boston - LCICon

Submission Guidelines: Camera ready artwork in either a .jpg, .png or .tif file. When submitting written copy only, not camera ready, an additional \$25.00 will be charged for ad design. You will be asked to sign off on any ad created for you. Specify ad size and number of issues the ad will run.

Vital Information

The MD19 Second Half Dues statements were emailed January 15-17, 2024 to Club Treasurers or Secretary/Treasurers. If no email address was available or returned as undeliverable, they were mailed January 18th. Dues are based on the December 31st membership total or from the most recent WMMR received at LCI. If your club has not received an MD19 dues statement, please contact the office ASAP – md19admin@lionsmd19.org or call 360-733-4911.

Notification of dues: An Aweber email was sent informing all on our email listing about these dues being sent. Before asking us to resend the statement please ask your treasurer first to see if they have received the MD19 second half dues statement. Make sure they also check the junk/spam folder of their email program as the statements may be sent there instead of the inbox.

Secretaries and Treasurers: Check the MD19 Website (www.lionsmd19.org) under "Toolbox>Stats" to make sure your dues were received and posted. If you've sent a check it could be that it has not yet been received. Check with the office to confirm.

District Spring Conventions: Club secretaries will receive an email with information on their delegate allotment. To keep you informed, you should receive from your district leadership items on what you will be voting on at your district convention.

Dues: A club must have their MD19 2023-2024 Second Half Dues **paid** prior to the District Convention for delegates to vote.

Club Officers for the Lions year 2024-2025 should be elected prior to April 15th. Your PU101 (International) must be completed and received by LCI AND the MD19 Office on or before May 15th. Instructions for doing the PU101 online with your clubs' MyLCI site can be found in the MD19 Contests and Awards Book under Secretary Excellence Award Rules. An AWeber notification with the instructions will also be sent in March.


Help Wanted
