Last year at one of the district conferences, I overheard somebody saying they would never become a Zone Chairperson because they would have to speak in front of a crowd.



I have run that conversation through my head ever since thinking about what my response should've been. I would like to share with you my experience as a Lion.

I became a Lion in 1992 and one of the first jobs was Tail Twister. The reason I took that job on is that I had a fear of speaking in front of a crowd. I don't mean that I was just a little nervous I was actually petrified whenever I had to get up and speak. But I also felt like I really wanted to get over that. I thought that being Tail Twister would give me that opportunity to stand before a friendly crowd. My club was generally about 20 people. I knew one of two things would happen, either they would support me or they would be waiting for me to fail. What I found with my club is that I got the support, not once did I ever feel like they were members that were hoping that I would fail. As I became comfortable speaking to my Lions Club I took on the job of third vice president in over the next three years moved up the ladder to becoming president. I became very comfortable speaking in front of my club.

I remember the meeting I went to when I agreed to become a Zone Chairperson. After the vote, I had this horrible feeling in my stomach like; what in the world have I done? Once again, I worried that I would have to get up in front of strangers and speak. Part of this fear was that I was not confident in my knowledge about Lions, especially since we had several Lions in our area that were incredibly knowledgeable. Once again, I wondered would I get support from my fellow Lions or would they simply stand back and watch me fail. My experience as Zone Chairperson was excellent; I considered my role of Zone Chairperson to be a success. I turned in all the reports on time, send out monthly newsletters and I have the appropriate amount of zone meetings. Most importantly, I was supported completely by everyone in my zone.

The experience I had as District Governor and this year as Council Chairperson is exactly the same. I have received incredible support from my fellow Lions, I can't say that that's 100% and I can't say that that's always going to happen. But the vast majority of times our fellow Lions want us to succeed. Our motto is "We Serve" and of course that means that we serve others, but I also think it means we need to take care of ourselves. I don't mean that in a financial way, I mean that in a physical and a mental way. Being a Lion especially in a leadership role is an opportunity for personal growth.

If you're thinking about taking on a leadership role such as Zone Chairperson or District Governor, you should absolutely do it so you can benefit your community but you should also do it for personal growth. Just do it!

Joel Haggen is a retired auto dealer and currently a woodturning artist. He is married to Vicki, Past President of the Fairhaven Lions Club and has four children, one of which is a Lion in the Burlington Lions Club and four grandchildren. He enjoys working in his



"park-like yard" and is a renown cat lover as well as a classic car enthusiast. His biggest joy is being with his Lion friends in all their activities and visiting Lion's Clubs wherever he goes.

Joel joined Bellingham Fairhaven Lions Club in 1976 and was immediately named Secretary where he quickly learned what being a Lion was all about. Joel held many offices as a Fairhaven Lion and had the pleasure of being the Cabinet Secretary for his good friend DG Dick Banning.

Joel received a liver transplant in 2008. In a subsequent surgery to check their work a sponge was sewn up inside and led to many complications. Two ambulance rides and a helicopter ride later, he stabilized and began a long recovery process. His thorough annual checkups show him to be in excellent health since then. He remained as a Lion throughout this time and finally became active again in 2012. His club was failing as its members died off and discussions were held to close it down. Joel agreed to be President to find ways to disperse the funds that were accrued from a land sale it had made the first time he was President. Upon thinking about it, he couldn't stand the idea of closing the club where he had met so many amazing people. He felt he owed it to them to keep the club going. He came across a project that sounded like it was up their alley. So, the Fairhaven Lions Legacy project of 2017 was born. Fairhaven Lions Club joined with Recreation Northwest in the building of the Fairhaven Trail in Fairhaven Park. A project that keeps changing and expanding. The club made a rebound with this, and Joel was inspired to be Zone Chair and eventually District Governor. He is returning to his club this July as President to use the skills he has learned from not just being DG but what he has learned from all the visits to other clubs.

Joel is also the Past President and board member of the Historic Fairhaven Association which he joined to better tie the Fairhaven Lions to their Community.

He has served two consecutive terms as Zone Chair for 19-H1 and received the Zone Chairperson Excellence Award on both those terms.


Joel is especially proud of his Melvin Jones Fellowship and a Gordon Smith Fellowship

Chilliwack Lions Contribute to the New SAR Facility

Chilliwack Lions Club members attended a very cold ground breaking ceremony January 16, 2024 to present another \$5,000.00 to add to the previous \$2,000.00 donated toward construction of the new, \$3-million building for Chilliwack Search and Rescue (SAR).

Chilliwack SAR started in 1986 with eight members who responded to 12 calls that year. In 2021, the group had grown to about 45 members and responded to 121 calls. Their fleet of vehicles went from three in 1986 to 14 in 2021.

SAR president Greg Unruh, a 30+ year veteran reflected on Chilliwack's growth over the decades. They outgrew their old site years ago and a new building is very much needed.

"We started off with 30 calls a year, now we're doing 100 a year on average. Increasing demands on a SAR

volunteer requires them to be more qualified, and it takes more effort to get them qualified."

This vital project will dramatically improve the operational capacity of B.C.'s third busiest SAR team by offering significantly more space for a growing fleet and rescue equipment. It will have a training space which includes a large class-room plus breakout rooms for the team of 34 dedicated volunteers.

"The building has been designed to remain functional in the event of a natural disaster and ensures that Chilliwack residents can rely upon the assistance of a highly skilled search and rescue response for the foreseeable future.

Gerry Enns Contracting is the builder and it's expected to be completed in October 2024.

It took eight weeks to tear down the former SAR facility and prepare the ground for the new building. During construction, volunteers will be based out of a temporary location so they can continue to operate 24/7.

The old, falling apart, cracked and drafty collection of buildings on Fifth Avenue was demolished and the new building will be built on the same site.

Vital Information

District Conferences / Conventions - Remember: Your club must have paid the MD19 dues for 2023-2024 before being allowed to vote at either your district convention or the MD19 Annual Convention. A list will be sent to the MD19 elections committee showing which clubs are still owing for the year. They may contact you for confirmation of payment.

The 2024-25 PU101 Report Form is due in the MD19 Office on or before May 15 (or as soon as you hold your club election). If you did not receive the information on how to do the PU101, via AWeber in March, contact the office and we will send you instructions for doing the LCI PU101 from your club's site. Once completed, send a copy to the following Email address: md19lions@lionsmd19.org. Hard copies can be mailed to 4141 Bennett Drive, Bellingham, WA 98226. With LCI changing over the Lions Portal, getting on to make updates or reporting may be a bit challenging. See more on that transition on page 13.

Please send a copy of your PU101 Report Form to your current 1st Vice District Governor and Zone Chairperson. Before sending to the MD19 Office or anyone else: double check with all your incoming club officers to make sure the information provided on the form is correct and update your club officer's information via MyLCI if necessary. If your club has a P.O. Box, ask your officers if they want their mail delivered to the club P.O. Box or to their personal home or business address.

If all information is not available, send what you can. Call the MD19 Office if you need assistance. **Remember:** The International PU101 goes to **LCI and to the MD19 Office**. The form allows the new officer information to be provided to the current 1st VDG (your incoming DG) and the Zone Chairperson.

Club Officer Training: As was done last year, online club officer training will be provided and information will be sent out by those conducting the training.

The MD19 2024 Club Officer Manuals will be available shortly on the MD19 Website under "Toolbox" and then "Learning". They can be downloaded and kept on your computer for quick reference. They are still being updated, but that will be completed shortly.

MD19 Recognition of Excellence forms for Club President, Treasurer and Membership Director Recognition of Excellence forms are available on the MD19 website (Toolbox>Forms>Club Report Forms). An AWeber message will be sent as a reminder shortly (close to the end of May). These forms need to be sent to the MD19 Office by July 25, 2024. Officers and Clubs that meet the criteria for the MD19 Recognition of Excellence will receive their recognition at Zone meetings and DG/ZC vistations. The recipients will further be recognized in an appropriate way at the follwing MD19 Annual Convention. There is no form to fill out for the Club Secretary Recognition of Excellence nor for the Zone Chairperson Recognition of Excellence. The criteria for these awards are tracked by MD19 throughout the year.

Lions Clubs International (LCI) has a Club Excellence Award. The LCI 2023-24 Club Excellence Award Application form can be found on LCI's website at: https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/resources-for-members/resource-center Enter the words, "2024 Club Excellence Award." MD19 Clubs that meet the criteria for the LCI Club Excellence Award receive a banner patch and the Club President receives a lapel pin. It will be sent to the 2024-25 District Governor for awarding.

Dear All Lions of Canada;

I am a Retired RCMP Officer with 31 years' service and am the Chairman of the Board of Directors for Lions Quest Canada. I am writing to you and request your undivided attention just for a few minutes.

Lions Quest Canada is a registered Canadian Charity with the following Mission Statement: "Provide leadership, knowledge and resources to develop capable young Canadians of positive character." This program has been implemented in schools across Canada for over forty years. We employ qualified individuals who train

the teachers, and in many cases everyone in the schools, how to use the programs that focus on teaching young people important life skills, building character, and helping them become leaders. By looking at education in a complete way Lions Quest is shaping the next generation, giving them tools to handle life's challenges by creating safe and supportive places for learning. Our <u>Social and Emotional Learning</u> (SEL) program is rated by many we have trained as cutting edge and extremely effective. We have had volumes of success stories over the years and across this great country. Incidentally this same program is used throughout the world with the support of Lions in these many countries.

It should be noted that Lions Quest Canada trained staff and provided support to Tim Horton Children's Foundation which is still used today with their Camp Programs. Lions Quest USA has partnered with Disney with the Lions Quest Program through the Choose Kindness Alliance and has also been endorsed by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime.

Lions Quest Programs within Canada are needed more than ever due to the mental health crisis. Children, families, schools and communities (including Indigenous) will benefit with our Program. Lions Quest is the only SEL program in Canada that connects the schools with the community. We hold workshops for the community and train non-educators. The RCMP and other Law Enforcement across Canada has recognized Lions Quest Programs. It is a very useful tool to combat gang and terrorism recruitment. It is recognized by the RCMP INSET and Dare Program.

Lions Clubs & Lions know they are making a huge difference within their communities. We are asking you to be a yearly partner with Lions Quest Canada and help us make a difference with our youth starting at the Kindergarten Level to High School within Canada. As Lions, we help pay for the entire cost of workshops, so there is no burden to the school budgets or taxpayers.



Since 2003, Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation owns 100% rights to the program around the world. Every Lion and Lions Club is an owner, stakeholder, and shareholder of the Program - but only 9% of Lions Clubs are currently supporting Lions Quest Canada. We have 1,349 English speaking Lions Clubs in Canada. Something needs to change!

July 2018, our Board of Directors met in person at a hotel in Winnipeg, Manitoba. We have a director representing every Province across the country except for Quebec. We paid our own way to Winnipeg to have a face-to-face meeting. We examined our past and explored our future. Out of the blue without knowledge we had a visit from a student, who grew up learning Lions Quest in his School asked 'where is Q Bear?'. At that moment, we decided to bring Q Bear back. We decided to make sweeping changes to our Constitution and By-laws, which took a lot of work. I am thankful for the teamwork done by the Directors!

July 2022, I took over the role of Chair. We formed three Committees (Governance, Fundraising and Finance) to ensure we are on track. A few good Lions helped pay for a financial review. Why did they pay? We are not getting the financial support that we used to get prior to the Covid Pandemic. Lions Quest Canada and the Board of Directors have changed with the times, but we are certainly not getting the support from our owners, stakeholders, and shareholders. It needs to change!

During our face-to-face District Lions Quest Chairs meeting in Toronto, Ontario in September 2023, we asked the Lions Quest Chairs to go back to their Districts and share information about the new initiatives, apply to LCIF for District Community Partnership Grants to educate the communities and Lions who care for youth. The Community Workshops are for you (our owners) to learn about Lions Quest with a few other Community Leaders. For the Lion who says they do not know anything about Lions Quest, this is the perfect workshop to learn and understand!

Lions Quest Canada has provided extra ways to show your appreciation to Lions and those who make a difference with children & youth. We have four award levels. A great way to recognize the efforts done in your community while also supporting Lions Quest Canada. You can donate money to Lions Quest Canada as a Lions Club or Individual. As an Individual, you will receive a tax receipt for any donation over \$20.00. Another way to support Lions Quest is to hold workshops for the community and schools. We need this support to happen monthly since we have bills to pay and salaries for our two employees. We ask your club to budget \$500.00 annually. In fact, if every Lions Club sent us \$100.00 now, we would meet our budget. As Art Williams said, "Just Do It!" (Google & watch the video).

Lastly, if you really want your Lions Club to learn and understand Lions Quest, please ask a Lion to be a Lions Quest Chair within your Club, join your District Lions Quest Committee and help. We do not employ salespeople; we only share information!
