This event is an excellent opportunity to build leadership capabilities and foster personal growth. Many previous attendees highly recommend it.

MD19 Council Chairperson - Steve Brooks



Our Lions year is already half over and our First Vice District Governors are starting their training to become District Governors in a few months. It is an exciting time and possibly a little scary for the First Vice District Governors as their training from Lions International is beginning. They are busy with online assignments and establishing goals for their respective Districts along with helping the current District Governors with visitations. I am sure that they have been working with the current District Governors and District Cabinets to review goals for this year and to refine goals for next year. We in all of MD19 are fortunate to have great upcoming District Governors as part of the team. January 13 marked the 147th birthday of Lions International founder Melvin Jones. Our Lions International Foundation (LCIF) had a special pin designed for anyone that donated \$147 on his birthday. Through generous donations of our MD19 Lion members and clubs, we collectively have donated over \$171,000 so far this year towards LCIF.

I have a feeling that we will exceed the amount of donations from the previous year. Many Lions have asked why should I donate to LCIF? In MD19 we have gotten back far more money over the years than we have donated to LCIF. Many clubs make donations in the last half of the Lions year.

District 19-L received a \$75,000 matching grant at the beginning of this Lions year for Vancouver Island "Home Away from Home" project providing a place for families to stay while kids go through cancer treatment. District 19-O just received a \$15,000 emergency grant to help the Renton Lions Youth Camp with repairs following the recent flooding. MD19 just received a \$25,000 US (\$18,519 Canadian) LCIF matching grant to benefit Easter Seals House in British Columbia for room restoration. There are several clubs that have been able to receive LCIF matching grants for local projects. If your community has a project, I strongly encourage you to look into LCIF grants.

Recently I had the opportunity to reconnect with a former Lion member who had dropped out of Lions several years ago. This person always kept the spirit of Lions at heart even though they could not afford the dues to continue as a member because they lost their home and was homeless. This person told me how they used the spirit of Melvin Jones to purchase a Melvin Jones Fellowship and use that as an inspiration to change their personal situation. I am happy to report that this person has now rejoined Lions and is now member of an active club.

Mission 1.5 from Lions International is an initiative to grow our world-wide membership to 1.5 million members by 2027. This will be accomplished by chartering new clubs and growing membership in our communities. There are several new clubs in work across MD19 in each of our districts. I encourage everyone to look at the MD19 website and click on the "Grow With Us" logo for information about growing membership as part of our coordinated campaign to attract new members, form new clubs, and introduce more people of the power of Lions. We received a \$10,000 marketing grant to help promote and grow our membership through Social Media. In California, MD4 used this approach and they have added 16 new clubs so far this Lions Year. I know that MD19 can have similar if not better results by promoting ourselves. Our 2026 MD19 annual convention is going to be in Wenatchee Washington, May 22-23. Lots of planning is taking place to make this a different and better convention. For example, Fun Night is going to be family friendly with entertainment provided at a local winery, we are working on transportation to and from. There are local things that your family can participate in while you are at the Lions Convention. Our International Guest is our current International 1st VP Mark Lyon and his wife Lion Lyn. The Lions Motto of "We Serve" does not know borders and members of MD19 are not the cause of political tensions. I want to encourage everyone to seriously consider attending our 2026 MD19 Convention to show that Lions are strong and can set an example of strength and unity.

After breakfast at the hotel, tour Bailuzhou (White Crane Island) Park, the Egret Goddess Sculpture in the central area of the park is one of Xiamen's urban symbols, and there is also Pigeons Square and Photography Square. The park is home to 400 square pigeons imported from the Netherlands, allowing visitors to interact with them. The musical fountain is also spectacular during festivals.



After lunch, by ferry to Gulangyu Island, the "Exhibition of World Architecture", designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2017.



The island is motor car free, boasts buildings of diverse styles, including Western architectural styles such as Gothic architecture, Baroque architecture; it also features Minnan-styles buildings represented by red-brick ancient houses, which are exquisitely decorated and carry unique cultural connotations. Also visit to the renowned Piano Museum housing Pianos from the 19th centuries before returning to Xiamen.

Important Changes to the 108th International Convention Schedule, hosted in Hong Kong!

Dear Lions and Leos,

We are writing to share some important updates to our 2026 international convention in Hong Kong.

As many of you know, we moved convention to Hong Kong after our planned destination of Atlanta was cancelled by the city of Atlanta due to the FIFA World Cup. Our host Lions and the city of Hong Kong stepped up to help us transition to our new location. As we worked together to support this significant shift, we recently identified schedule adjustments needed to align with our host city's guidelines and maintain the convention's overall structure.

We will be updating our Convention Schedule webpage on lionscon.org with more details as they are confirmed, but here are some initial updates we'd like to share with you.

- Convention Dates – Convention dates are not changing, only the convention schedule, so we will still be hosting the convention July 3-7.
- Plenary Sessions – Our three plenary sessions will be moved up one day, now scheduled for July 4-6.
- Parade of Nations – The parade will be moved to Tuesday, July 7 pending finalization of plans.

Is Your Club Keeping Up With The Times? - Past Council Chair John Moralek

Almost 20 years ago when I first joined the Lions, the club I started with made an annual donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation (L.C.I.F.) of \$1,000 and additional funds were given to other worthy causes. The club raised money by making pancakes for breakfasts and held an annual dinner. The cost of the breakfast was \$2.50 per person, and the dinner was (I think) \$25. With these events the club raised \$7,000.

Fast forward to today, and that pancake breakfast raises money through a donation bucket, to which most attendees donate close to \$10 each. The banquet prices are now upwards of \$60 and together these events generate \$20,000. Interestingly, the donation dollars to the worthy causes remain the same as they were 20 years ago. (Please note that a great deal of new causes have been added during the last 20 years).

In other words, while the income stream from donations has grown threefold, the donated amount to the supported causes remains unchanged. Does this sound like your club? When was the last time you evaluated your club budget?

MD19 DIABETES AWARENESS REPORT

February 6-7, 2026

Council Chair and Council,



Diabetes is one of the most common chronic diseases affecting people WORLD WIDE. Around 589 million people over a year old live with diagnosed diabetes. This number excludes gestational diabetes. Worldwide at the end of 2024 there were 589 million adults (20-79) living with diabetes, it is projected that by 2050 there will be a rise of 853 million adults living with diabetes. It's also projected that as of today there are 252 million people living with undiagnosed diabetes, it's time we got out in our communities to bring awareness to everyone so we can slow that down.

I have found over the past few years that getting the word out to our clubs/members regarding diabetes is difficult. I am unable to travel to each and every club to show off my "sugar board," which would certainly be a wake-me-up for anyone who glances at it. The monthly newsletters have the same old news each month; which I would not be surprised that almost everyone who receives it files it in the round storage bin. So how can I help us get the word out to all of our members, I ask you, please send me suggestions.

Step Challenge update:


At the challenges halfway point of fifteen weeks there are 363 participants in our Multiple District taking part in this challenge. As of January 25th the total number of steps for all is: 262,419,859 steps. The participation fee of \$5.00 per person has been submitted by over half of the group, those that still need to submit can contact me for where to send their cheque.

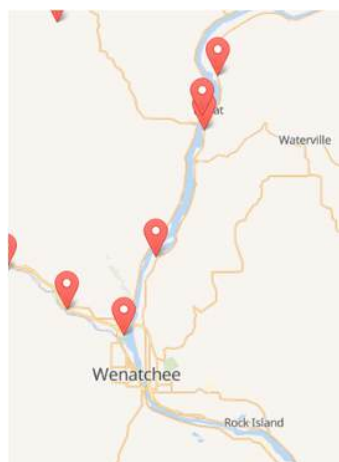

Vital Information

The MD19 Second Half Dues statements

were emailed January 13-15, 2026, to Club Treasurers or Secretary/Treasurers. If no email address was available or returned as undeliverable, they were mailed January 16th. Dues are based on the December 31st membership total or from the most recent WMMR received at LI (Lions International). If your club has not received an MD19 dues statement, please contact the office ASAP – md19admin@lionsmd19.org or call 360-733-4911.

Notification of dues: An Aweber notification was sent on February 6, 2026, informing all on our email listing that these dues were sent. Before asking us to resend the statement please ask your treasurer first to see if they have received the MD19 second half dues statement. Make sure they also check the junk/spam folder of their email program as the statements may be sent there instead of the inbox. COPIES of these statements were also sent to your Zone Chairpersons, District Governors and Cabinet Secretaries.

Secretaries and Treasurers: Check the MD19 Website (www.lionsmd19.org) under “Toolbox>Stats” to make sure your dues were received and posted. If you’ve sent a check/cheque it could be that it has not yet been received. Check with the office to confirm. Canadian Clubs **do** have the option of sending their dues payment as an e-transfer. Contact our office on how to make that happen.

District Spring Conventions: Club secretaries will receive a letter with their delegate/alternate slips at least three weeks prior to their District Conventions. To keep you informed, you should receive from your district leadership items on what you will be voting on at your district convention.

Dues: A club must have their MD19 2025-2026 Second Half Dues paid prior to the District Convention for delegates to vote.

Club Officers for the Lions year 2026-2027 should be elected prior to April 15th. Your PU101 (International) must be completed and received by LI AND the MD19 Office on or before May 15th. Since we are now using the new Lions Portal, instructions on submitting new club officers to LCI (as well as MD19) will be sent in March via an AWeber notification.

Canadian LCIF Donations: Send donations directly to LCIF. Canadian clubs requiring a tax receipt send checks to: Lions of Canada Fund for LCIF, C/O Peter Oswald, 22 Dundana Ave., Dundo, ON L9H 4E6. If only an acknowledgement letter is needed (no tax receipt required), send your donation to: Lions Clubs International Foundation, P.O. Box 2425, Station “A”, Toronto, Ontario M5W 2K5. All cheques must have proper identification of donors (full club name/club number and member name and number). LCIF Canada – This link will take to the Canadian LCIF website where the forms can be found (under FAQs heading).

US clubs send your checks to: LCIF, Department 4547, Carol Stream, IL 60122-4547, USA.

CARE Donations: both US and Canadian are sent to the MD19 Office. For US Clubs send to 4141 Bennett Drive, Bellingham, WA 98226. For Canada send your CARE cheques to P.O. Box 1621, Aldergrove, B.C, V4W 2V1. Make checks out to: MD19 Lions CARE.

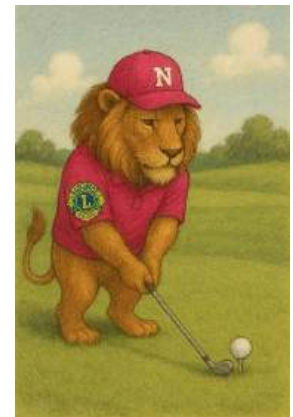

Bringing holiday cheer to WA island children aboard the 'Christmas Ship'
Tradition originated about 75 years ago, still sails annually to the San Juans'

"It's 7 a.m. two Saturdays before Christmas, and I'm scanning the cruise terminal for the most festive ship on Bellingham Bay. In 30 minutes I'm due to embark on an assignment — albeit not strictly as a reporter.

Today, I am a reindeer named Prancer. I'm helping the Lions Club bring holiday cheer to children on the San Juan Islands, as they've done every year since the late '90s.

Aboard the so-called "Christmas Ship," I'm joined by more than 25 other passengers in various states of merry: elves, carolers, pirates and Santa himself. A former music teacher practices "Jingle Bell Rock" as day breaks over the Salish Sea. Mrs. Claus tucks into a plate of bacon and eggs.

Over the loudspeaker, project lead Sandra Ball sets expectations: "Thank you for being part of the greatest adventure of all time," she announces, a twinkle of childlike glee in her voice.

While the Christmas Ship is among the Lions' most popular projects, the tradition predates their involvement. It began about 75 years ago — a time before Washington state ferries, and when island youth were unlikely to ever encounter Santa at department stores. Generations thus grew up believing the jolly old man travels by boat, not sleigh.

"Grandparents [tell] us that they used to come out when they were kids," said Ball, who is a member of the Mount Vernon Lions Club. "Inevitably, most people that you talk to will tell you that this event kicks off their Christmas season."
