



Vision to Improve Vision in Our Youth

In 2015, the Alberni Valley Lions Club wanted to take on a service project to provide vision screening to students in the local schools. At that time, it took two or more clubs involved to apply for an LCIF grant, which was needed for the equipment. The Club took it to the Zone's



Spring District Governor's Advisory meeting and the Zone made the decision to take on the screening project. Next it needed to be approved by the District Governor. It was decided to take it on as a District Project, and so was born the District 19-I Vision Screening Project.

The Clubs in the District were quick to respond and a request for a matching grant to purchase three Vision Screeners was submitted to LCIF. It was approved in the fall of 2015. With funds available, four screeners were purchased and one Club purchase their own! We hit the ground running with five vision screeners in the District.

Next, we needed schools and trained Lions. Training the Lions was easier than getting the schools on board. But once a few schools began to participate, the word spread and the domino effect took place with other schools. To this day, we still have a few dominoes left standing but we haven't given up!

In the first year of screening, 1,908 students in 38 schools were screened. 137 of those students were referred for further examination by an appropriate eye doctor. After five years of screening, our dedicated Lions have made 281 School visits with 20,044 students screened and 1,269 of those students were referred for further examination.

I personally have been involved in screening students and I don't think I've enjoyed doing anything more at the Club level than this. One experience that I had was screening a young immigrant student who was in dire need of further examination. The next year when returning to screen it was exhilarating to see this student wearing glasses.

As District Governor I plan to continue promoting this extremely valuable program and can only hope that we can knock over the few remaining standing Dominoes.

19-I DG Cec Specht has been a Lion for 38 years, and his wife Cathy has been a Lion for over 10 years. Cec is retired, a former member of the Royal Canadian Navy, he has also been Executive Director for a Family Services Association, and for a Home Health Care Association. Additionally, he has worked as a computer software instructor and most recently he and Cathy worked as Travel Agents.

MD19 Lions Annual Convention Tour

MISS VEEDOL AT PANGBORN MEMORIAL AIRPORT

Miss Veedol was the first airplane to fly non-stop across the Pacific Ocean. On October 5, 1931, Clyde Pangborn, with co-pilot Hugh Herndon, crash-landed their plane in the hills of East Wenatchee, Washington, in the central part of the state, becoming the first to fly non-stop across the northern Pacific Ocean. The 41-hour flight from Sabishiro Beach, Misawa, Aomori Prefecture, Japan won them the 1931 Harmon Trophy, symbolizing the greatest achievement in flight for that year.



Afterward, Miss Veedol was sold and renamed The American Nurse. On a 1932 flight from New York City to Rome for aviation medicine research, she was last sighted by an ocean liner in the eastern Atlantic, before disappearing without trace.

A local group founded the Spirit of Wenatchee a nonprofit organization of EAA Chapter 424 pilots. They are attempting the ambitious project of recreating the historic flight and have built a replica of the Miss Veedol.


Are you ready to unleash your inner BEaST?
