When I first became a Lion, I was inspired by the work the Lions did in Vision. I was fortunate enough to pick up and deliver corneas for transplant. At a low point in my Lions journey, a man came up to me at a fund-raising project of my local club. He handed me a one-hundred-dollar bill. I started to make change and he told me no, he wanted to make a small donation because the Lions Club gave him the gift of sight. We talked for a while, and I asked when he had the surgery? It turns out that I had taken the cornea that had been used in his surgery to the hospital. This recharged my batteries and let me know that one person can make a large difference in the world.

Later, I was blessed with working with the Special Olympics and the Opening Eyes program. Every year we would screen hundreds of athletes and provide glasses, goggles, or sunglasses to meet the athletes needs. Recently, I took over collecting used eyeglasses to deliver to the Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center from my dad. Between my wife Tracie and I we recycle over one thousand pair a year to the center.

One thing I am passionate about is working with the entire community to make it a better place to live. In that spirit it is my belief that all the service clubs in an area should work together and in support of what each group does. When we accomplish this, we better serve our community. Therefore, my theme is **"We Serve Better Together"**.

I look forward to serving all of the clubs in my district, concentration on retention of our members, working on membership ideas like specialty clubs to bring in different types of clubs,. As well as, reaching out to community members by inviting them to assist us in our projects. Continued support of our district projects including the Mary Bridge Childhood Cancer Program, the Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center, and LCIF.

KOTB Vision

The MD19 Lions Knights of the Blind Committee was recognized and endorsed by the MD19 Council of Governors in October 2020. Earlier this year the committee decided to clarify their vision: **“Continuing Helen Keller’s Challenge – Lions Empowering Blind Abilities through Access, Inclusiveness and Technology!”**

Much of this is being done by outreach through District Conferences, Zone and Club meetings. We need to insure that all our members have **Access**

- whether it is describing the words and details in a PowerPoint presentation instead of assuming everyone can read them, or
- knowing that the Lions Magazine is and has been available in audio format by Lions reading and recording these for the last 20 years.

We encourage **Inclusiveness** by sharing information on common courtesies

- like paying attention to people who are blind as you would any other individual, instead of averting your attention to make you more comfortable.
- Saying your name when you enter the room, just as many of us have learned to do at ZOOM meetings, so people know who is talking.

Being aware of and implementing **Technology** that

- allows clubs to accept online payments for dues and make membership documents accessible so a Lion who is blind can be responsible for themselves.
- Other Technology not only makes smart phones, computer screens, and movies accessible, but the many free apps, including Be My Eyes that connects people who are blind or have low vision with a global community of volunteers and company representatives who are ready to lend their eyesight for everyday tasks.

Of all people, we Lions, Knights of the Blind, should be aware of what we can do to empower and acknowledge **Blind Abilities**.

Today, the image of the modern straight white cane is displayed on the LCI website as an empowering symbol of Independence, Mobility and Safety, not as a tool to garner pity and contributions for those who are blind, or for other noble but unrelated Lions Services.

Yelm Lions Club paid a visit to LERC (Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center) and brought in 220 pairs of eyeglasses to be processed. Vice President of Operations, Lion Ike Ikari greeted the group and a tour of the facility was provided to the Yelm Lions Club visitors. The group stuck around and provided a combined total of 27.5 man-hours of volunteer time. During this time they washed 16 loads of glasses and inspected them. This produced 68 pairs of high quality glasses and three and a half boxes of glasses to be sent on to RESPECS recycling plant in California. Lion Barrie Wilcox had this to say, "Being longtime Lions Members, it was really rewarding for us to visit the LERC and take the excellent tour and then volunteer cleaning some of the many donated glasses. This volunteer Lions Center does wonderful work of supplying needed glasses to many many underprivileged people all over the world."

For those secretaries who have the capability, it is possible to take a screen shot, paste it to a Word document, save it and email it to the MD19 Office; otherwise, the report must be mailed directly to the MD19 Office.

Other MD19 Recognition – Notification has been emailed to Secretaries.

MD19 2022-23 First Half Dues Statements: In late July or early August, the 1st Half MD19 Dues Statements will be emailed out to Lions Club Treasurers or Secretary-Treasurers. If no email address has been provided on the LCI Club Officer Report Form, the Dues Statements will be mailed as hard copies.

The 2022-2023 MD19 Roster: The MD19 2022-23 Rosters will be mailed out in August in a very restricted manner. They will automatically be sent to each Lions Club Secretary ONLY. There will also be available the PDF version of the roster that can be sent to anyone who wishes it. For those wishing to purchase a hard copy of the MD19 2022-2023 Roster be aware that there will be a limited supply available after sending to the Club Secretaries and once they are gone then your only option will be to receive the PDF.

IMPORTANT: LCI and MD19 no longer gives dues credit for dropped members reported on the July and January WMMRs. Dropped members need to be reported on the June and December WMMRs in order to avoid paying for members no longer in the club.
